2011 Spring Fish and Game Hearings

If you have an interest in natural resources, conservation, hunting, fishing, trapping or outdoor recreation in Wisconsin then the Spring Hearings are for you.

On Monday, April 11, there will be 72 public hearings, one in each county starting at 7:00 p.m. where individuals interested in natural resources management have an opportunity to provide their input by non-binding vote and testimony to the Department Of Natural Resources, Natural Resources Board and the Conservation Congress on proposed hunting and fishing rule changes and advisory questions.

To be eligible to vote, you must be a resident of that county in which you are attending the meeting.

Important Safety Concern – Please disarm trap machines before entering the trap house. There have been times when we have entered the houses and they are still armed –

this can be a very painful experience for the next person to go in front of the house if it accidentally trips and sends out a bird.

Spring is just around the corner and so are the trap and skeet leagues. Leagues start on Wednesday, April 6. You can shoot Wednesdays or Thursdays from 5:00 pm until 8:30 pm. We always have a fair amount of teams, so get your forms in early for registration. Please see the web site for registration forms. You must have four scores in by the end of week four. You can shoot ahead after that a maximum of 4 weeks.

The following 20 week events will be offered:

Skeet – regular skeet – five person teams

Trap – 16 yard trap – five person teams

Hunt & Cover – 22 yard – two person teams – straight scores, not a handicap league

Trap Doubles – the 2nd half of the season (10 week event)

Learn-to-Hunt Turkey Program

The best five hours you will spend learning about turkey hunting or sharing your knowledge with a new hunter! We are looking for novice turkey hunters and adult turkey hunting mentors to participate in a Learn-to-Hunt-Turkey workshop at the DBCL clubhouse on March 12th from 10 a.m. – 3 p.m. The workshop covers strategy, biology, safety, ethics and shotgun patterning so that novice hunters will have the opportunity to hunt during the special April 2-3 LTH weekend (this is the weekend before the statewide youth hunt) within arm's reach of their mentor.

Leagues are for members and non-members. The fees will be \$5.00 for members and \$7.00 for non-members, per trap and skeet event and \$3.00 per person for Hunt and Cover. Sponsor fees are \$50.00 per team or \$10.00 per person if paid by May 6th. If fees are paid after May 6, the cost will increase to \$60.00 per team or \$12.00 per person.

Please note, team numbers will not be assigned and scores will not be posted this year until sponsor fees are paid. Also, squads must be signed up 15 minutes before closing time, no exceptions.

If you don't have a team, we can place you on one. Good shooter or novice, you will only shoot against teams of similar ability. Come out and joins us.

Practice and Sign Up Week – We will be holding a practice week on March 30 and 31 from 5:00 pm until 8:30 pm. This will be a time to get ready for league shooting and sign your team up. Remember – practice week only, scores will not be logged.

Breakfast Shoot – Mark your calendar for Sunday, March 13 for “Bacon, Eggs and Bullets” from 9:00 am until 1:00 pm. Breakfast will be served from 9 am until Noon with shooting from 10 am to 1 pm. Come on out, have some breakfast and shoot a few practice rounds. In conjunction with the breakfast shoot, we will also be holding a bake sale and food drive to benefit St Boniface Food Pantry in Germantown.

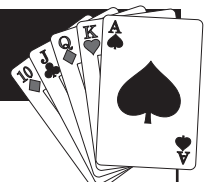
